Report from the Artistic Director BY ERICK LICHTE

The 2023-24 season created new expressions and endeavours which simultaneously brought the choir and organization closer to its vision, mission and values.

It was a season of large premieres- three 30-minute works by Don Macdonald, Kile Smith and Melissa Dunphy. In total, the choir premiered two and half hours of new music throughout the season. It was also a season of new expressions - the



choir sang about AI, archeology, radio transmissions, climate change, Barbie, angel visitations, flight, sailing, sin, and empathy. The diversity of these subjects and expressions helped make Chor Leoni, in my view, a choir of and for our times.

The choir also fearlessly, even effortlessly, changed its official name. Recognizing its core value of creating a space of belonging both inside and outside of the choir, the organization dropped the gendered term "male" from its name. So strong is the identity of this choir and organization that it knew it could be its best self without that defining moniker.

It's uncommon for an organization to do this many new and exciting things in one season. But it is even more rare when each of these new endeavours also deepens the organization's relationship to its vision, reinforces its values and furthers its mission. It is this marriage of boundary-pushing purpose with the choir's ability to create beauty, joy and connection which set Chor Leoni's 2023-24 season apart. It is also, I think, what makes Chor Leoni unique and vital for its local, national and international communities.

Chor Leoni's 2023-2024 season encapsulates everything we strive to achieve through the work of the organization: An engaging and diverse series of concerts reaching vast audiences across the Lower Mainland, familiar experiences that continue to expand Chor Leoni's reach, the creation of new music that is innovative, exploratory, and advances the art form, growing education programs that inspire the next generation of choral singers, and the fostering of a



community of singers whose passion, love for the art form, and joy are infectious and makes a true impact on our community and the world.

Some key highlights:

- 8,000 audience members across 17 concert experiences

BRINGING HIGH FLIGHT TO LIFE BY MARNI JOHNSON

The poem High Flight holds a deeply personal significance for both my husband Gord and me, as it is intimately connected to his father's legacy. A Second World War veteran and pilot, Ronald H. N. Roberts often spoke of this poem's power to capture the exhilaration and freedom of flight—experiences he knew so well. Singing was also a cherished part of Ron's life, so when we considered how best to honour his memory, commissioning a piece for Chor Leoni felt like the perfect tribute.

What I love most about Chor Leoni is the way they engage their audience. They do more than perform to the audience; they create a genuine connection with the audience. Our hope was that when the choir sang High Flight, everyone in the room would feel that bond—an unspoken understanding that, in those moments, we are all part of something larger than ourselves. It's an experience that transcends the music, offering a space for reflection and remembrance.





Being in the audience for the world premiere was an experience we will treasure forever. We are immensely grateful to the composer Don Macdonald, the choir and the instrumentalists for coming together to create this work of incomparable beauty.

We hope this piece continues to inspire and resonate, lifting up all who encounter it, just as it has for us.

HOPE IN SONG BY CAMERON WILSON

'A Midnight Clear' was commissioned by Chor Leoni for their annual Christmas concerts in 2023. It is scored for TTBB choir, piano, violin, harp, guitar and percussion and is a reworking of the original beloved carol.



Director Erick Lichte really inspired me by rearranging the original text of the carol. From there I was able to create a 3 part narrative, each section with a different tone and attitude that highlights the possibility of what a choir can do. The entire piece culminates in a joyous fiddle hoedown inspired by the fiddling of my father Keith Wilson who comes from the Ottawa Valley and from whom I learned the style.

For me, this piece is about hope. Hope for peace despite the ravages of war and hate. Hope for love and faith for a better future for all people. This is a message that resonates with all of us more than ever before.

It was a privilege and pleasure writing and performing this work with Chor Leoni.

GRINCH-BE-GONE BY NAOD YIMAM

I can relate to the Grinch. I totally get where he's coming from. In fact, if I took a DNA test I wouldn't be surprised to find out that I have some Grinch in me. I can get cynical during the holiday season, but like my distant relative, I can't stay grumpy when it's time to sing Christmas music. You try singing "Peace on the Earth, Goodwill to all" with a sour face.



Last year, I sang in my first Christmas with Chor Leoni. I didn't know what to expect, especially because we were performing six shows over three days. I knew it would be challenging and that the days would be long, but fortunately Chor Leoni is run by brilliant people who make it look easy. All I had to do was show up, put on my tux, and sing. The performances were fun, and we got to be playful while we sang. For me, the highlight of each show was the last song when we left the stage to stand around the pews and sing Silent Night with everyone. Those moments were so meaningful to me, and they reminded me of the values and beliefs that sustain me. So when I sing those familiar Christmas tunes, I choose to celebrate community and humanity.

For the past three years, it has been my great privilege to join Chor Leoni for the Big Roar choral festival as a member of The Leonids. Erick has brought together a real "dream team" of musicians, educators, and community builders. The connections—both musical and personal—that we have made with each other and members of Chor Leoni are ones that I treasure and look forward to deepening every year.



In 2024, the "Harmonia" concert was a particular pleasure with its varied styles, sensitively delivered poetry, and deep cultural significance. For example, it was so meaningful for us to have been able to perform Ily Matthew Maniano's arrangement of the traditional Filipino lullaby "Ili Ili" for members of the Philippine Madrigal Singers and connect with them after the concert. A PLACE TO BELONG BY BRIAN ARCHDEKIN

I had already been singing since long before I could remember, but things really changed in the 9th Grade when I first joined the Men's Choir at Oak Bay Secondary School in 2008. Before Remembrance Day that year, I had only ever treated choir as just another part of the grade school routine, and when the choral director, Sally Murphy, announced that the Men's Choir would be singing with



an adult choir from Vancouver, I felt no reason to expect anything out of the ordinary. However, singing with Chor Leoni would turn out to be one of the most impactful experiences in my entire musical life. I'll never forget the nervous hesitation I felt when the big day came and I was paired with one of the Lions. But it was none other than Paul Larocque whose warm kindness would reassure and welcome me fully into the awesome sound of these angelic voices. At the time, it felt like singing among a league of choral superheroes, being surrounded with a sound unlike anything to which I had been exposed before. Though each piece was special in its own way, the one that really stayed with me was The Kontakion, which I would eagerly await singing each subsequent opportunity that arose to sing with Chor Leoni. By the end of 2012, I had sung with Chor Leoni thrice, having been grandfathered into the 2012 Remembrance Day performance in Nanaimo despite having already graduated from Oak Bay Secondary earlier that year. I felt a bit wistful that someone else had been paired with the kind, warm man I had sung next to in my first year though, knowing that this would be the last time I would be able to sing with the Lions.

Or so I thought.

After a decade of soul-searching, I finally made the decision in 2022 at 27 years old to apply to study Music, and beyond all my expectations, I was accepted into my dream school: The University of British Columbia. The following year, inspired by the encouragement of Chor Leoni alumni Kelk Jeffrey and Alexis Vollant, I applied and was accepted into the Emerging Choral Artist Program (ECAP) in 2023, and again the following year in 2024. During the Big Roar each year, I recognized that same man who I sang alongside 16 years ago, but I never quite had the right moment to reconnect. It was only after being accepted into Chor Leoni itself for the 2024-25 season and coming full circle that I was finally able to thank Paul, who still sings with Chor Leoni to this day, for the impact he made on me when I was 14. The smile that Paul gave in response was the same smile that made me feel for the first time all those years ago that choir was where I truly belong.

THE STORY OF WIRELESS BY KILE SMITH

When Erick and I were discussing what the piece that ultimately became Wireless might be, I had no idea what a fascinating journey I was embarking on. The work, paired with one by Melissa Dunphy, would encompass a huge theme, enfolding all of humankind. Melissa's known interest in archaeology made the ground her natural subject, so that left the sky for me! Thus, the Earth & Aether concert was born.



Many ideas whittled themselves down to the birth of wireless broadcasting. I could only imagine what grand statements defining humanity's visions I would uncover. Well, while lofty sentiments pervade the universe of wired transmissions—historical pronouncements of kings and presidents in cross-Atlantic cables—very little of this turned up in the first, halting, wireless contacts, which were mostly experiments by lone engineering pioneers.

But these mundane reports, popular song renditions, opera broadcasts of a few miles, an impromptu speech, and distress signals from one Titanic, began to arrange themselves into a drama, a dreamscape I imagined could hold all of us on the globe together in one vision after all: the desire to come home again.

I was excited to work with Chor Leoni because I sing in (and have composed a few things for) a German Männerchor in Philadelphia. I love all kinds of music, but nothing beats the TTBB sound and its tradition. To hear Wireless come to life in Vancouver, led by Erick (who's also a tremendous sightseeing host!) is an experience my wife and I will never forget.



CRAFTING THE THINGS WE LEAVE BEHIND BY MELISSA DUNPHY

When Erick Lichte first reached out to me about writing music for Chor Leoni, I had little experience working with tenorbass choirs. I believe it's especially important for women to create music for lower voices, but I lacked the knowledge and confidence necessary to compose tenor-bass works on par with my mixed and treble ensemble songs. Erick offered thoughtful guidance and invaluable suggestions and was endlessly generous with his time and expertise; his encouragement and mentorship has had an enormous impact on my growth as a composer.



After collaborating with Erick on arrangements of several existing songs in my catalog for Chor Leoni, I was thrilled and delighted to embark on the much larger-scale project: *The Things We Leave Behind*. Erick proposed a broad subject that resonated deeply with me, inspiring me to craft my own texts for the cantata's eight movements. The exploration of material culture, mortality, and memory was incredibly meaningful, and it was emotionally fulfilling to present a unique perspective that I've yet to see in existing music or poetry.

Visiting Vancouver to engage with Chor Leoni was truly magical. The choir is a warm and welcoming community, and it was a privilege to receive the singers' feedback and witness their connection to the piece, particularly given how personal it was to me. Erick, as always, was extraordinarily generous with his time and expertise. I am excited for their upcoming recording project and cannot wait for Chor Leoni to share their music with an even wider audience, continuing to cement their international reputation as a premier tenor-bass ensemble.

C/4: CANADIAN CHORAL COMPOSITION COMPETITION

The Canadian Choral Composition Competition (C/4) is an innovative commissioning project that puts out a call across Canada for work samples from Canadian composers of any age or stage in their careers. From these submissions, three composers are chosen and are then commissioned to write a work for Chor Leoni. The composers work collaboratively with the organization to conceive and score their works, and near the premiere, are flown to Vancouver to work intensively with the choir. The works are then presented at Chor Leoni's C/4 event, where the compositions are sung, and the audience can interact and ask questions of the composer. Ultimately, a winner is chosen by votes from a panel of judges, the Chor Leoni singers, and the live audience.



"It was amazing to hear this piece. There's always that kind of anticipation, like, does this work? Do the sweet spots in the voice happen where I think they're going to happen? Do the chords ring the way I think they're going to ring?

And and it really worked. We made a couple of little changes that I think, were really important. And some of those discoveries things that are always going to happen in rehearsal. But to hear the full force of all the singers as the piece builds, and the commitment to- not just the big exciting sections, but the lyrical things.

And, yeah, that, that kind of collaboration and interaction is so exciting when you're making art. It was awesome."

"So the piece as it is now is the hero's journey, told from the most unlikely place, which is of course, a folk song for children through the story of a journey from darkness to light.

It's kind of like getting to light and getting there through loving and being loved. And once that story was kind of out there for me to tell, I realized that's the perfect story to tell through choir. And when I thought of the Chor Leoni organization, it seemed to fit the mandate that they've set out for themselves. And so I thought, you know, this is perfect.

What was it like finally hearing it? I thought I was going to explode, and I think I did. The sound was incredible, the voices were great. It was so nice to hear and just to hear all that stuff that I fretted about, wondering, is this going to work? Is this voicing going to make the choir sound as good as they as they can, and then just hearing it all kind of come together. It was relief, and joy, and just, yeah, it's awesome."



"I always thought the C/4 was the nerd's best concert because you have the score and you hear it twice. It's great.

Firstly, I love applications where you don't have to submit a finished piece or even a proposal. It's just "show us what you have done and maybe we'll call you." I like that a lot. I really appreciate that. And then the format is really great. I went to the one in 2022, and it was so fun. I didn't realize I was going to get a copy of the scores when I walked in.

That was so amazing. And then I didn't know they were going to sing them twice, and I was, like, actually, new music lover's dream. I think because you hear it for the first time, I think I just didn't look at the score. And then you just sort of let it wash over you.

And there's moments where you're like, oh, what's going on? That was cool. And then when you get to sort of revisit it, it's really fun. It's like studying."



Report from the Treasurer BY WENDY ENNS

The fiscal year ending July 31, 2024, was another very strong year for Chor Leoni. The financial picture was extremely positive and this allowed the organization to deliver many programs to further its mission and vision, and to invest for its future.

The year ended with a surplus of \$22,2<mark>37</mark> compared to a budgeted loss of (\$33,529) – a positive variance of \$55,766.

Performance revenue was up 19% (\$71,000) over the prior year. An increase was anticipated given a change in the pricing model for ticket sales.

Government grants were down 25% (\$67,000) over the prior year. In the prior year an unexpected grant was received from the BC Arts Council for \$87,000, which was not received in the current year. On the positive side, a \$17,500 grant was received from the BC Arts Council.

Chor Leoni also received a very generous gift which was specifically designated to be transferred to the endowment fund at the Chor Leoni Foundation:


 \$200,000 from the David Spencer Endowment Encouragement Fund.

Chor Leoni also received substantial value of \$171,467 in the form of in-kind sponsorships. For these gifts and in-kind sponsorships, the amounts are equally reflected in both revenues and expenses.

On a normalized basis, donations were down 35% (\$161,000) from the prior year. In the prior year two generous bequests were made to Chor Leoni of \$200,000 resulting in higher donation revenue in the prior year.

Chor Leoni's gala, Resound, was extremely successful by all measures. Revenues are reflected in the financial statements across performance revenue, donations and auctions/raffles. In total, the event generated net income of approximately \$200,000 which was \$50,000 above budget. The second year of the Resound gala was as great a success as the first year.

On a normalized basis, total revenue was down 7% or \$103,000 compared to the prior year.



On the expense side, there was the expected inflationary increase that had been accounted for in the budget:

- Artistic and performance expenses were up 11% (\$72,000),
- Administrative personnel increased by 6% (\$14,000), and
- Office and other administrative expenses increased nominally by 3% (\$4,000).

With an eye to future sustainability, Chor Leoni's Board of Directors transferred \$150,000 of undesignated funds to the Chor Leoni Foundation rather than retain these funds in its operating fund. Between the gifts that were designated to the Foundation (\$200,000) and the additional funds directed to the Foundation by Chor Leoni's Board (\$150,000), a total of \$350,000 was directed to the Foundation in fiscal year 2024.

The Diane Loomer Commissioning Fund was used to initiate several commissioned works, exceeding the annual income received from the Chor Leoni Diane Loomer Commissioning Endowment Fund at the Vancouver Foundation, and therefore resulting in a draw-down of the internal Diane Loomer Commissioning Fund. However, this internal fund still has a very healthy balance of approximately \$5,000 to use toward future commissions.

Chor Leoni received \$40,000 in income from the David Spencer MYVoice Endowment Fund to help fund the MYVoice program. In future years, it is expected the income from the David Spencer MYVoice Endowment Fund will increase substantially, likely covering all the expenses of the MYVoice program. As such, the internally restricted fund will no longer be needed to cover the deficit and has been depleted.

The Operating Fund ended the year with a balance of \$594,506, an increase of \$52,000 from the prior year. This operating fund is equal to approximately six months' worth of operating expenses, which is a reasonable cushion to ensure sustainability through uncertain times.

Thanks to its many generous donors and supporters, high-performing staff team and Board, and dedicated and talented choir members, Chor Leoni thrived in fiscal year 2024, delivering a tremendous range of exciting digital and live activities across a broad stakeholder base, while investing in its future. Chor Leoni is in a strong financial position to further its mission and vision.
